Rheem Australia announces 10 recipients of \$3,000 grants to support apprentice plumbers across Australia

2021 Rheem Apprentice Plumber Grants applicants showcase the changing face of plumbing with more career switchers, women and mature-age apprentices than ever before

Sydney, Australia – Rheem Australia has awarded a total of \$30,000 to the 10 deserving recipients of the 2021 Rheem Apprentice Plumber Grants, as Aussie apprentices bounce back after a challenging year.

This year saw the most diverse set of applicants in the grants' history, ranging from remote communities in the Northern Territory, to Kalgoorlie in Western Australia, Berriedale in Tasmania and everywhere in between.

Many of the 187 applicants have given up work in other industries to pursue a new career in plumbing. In 2021, more than half of the applications were from mature-age apprentices.

Chief Operating Officer at Rheem Australia, Chris Taylor, says, "The Rheem Apprentice Plumber Grants have always been a way to welcome those entering the plumbing industry. Rheem is passionate about investing in the development of skills in an industry that is in high demand, but has a declining growth rate."

Shortages in skills-based trades are a recurring trend with <u>research showing that</u> <u>commencements of apprenticeships and traineeships have dropped by over 20 per cent in the last year.</u>

"This year saw a large number of applications from all across Australia. Our independent judging panel was extremely impressed with high calibre and diversity of applications, with more mature-age and female applications than we've seen in previous years.

"The applicants show a level of passion and commitment for this industry that gives us confidence in its future," says Taylor.

An independent panel of industry experts carefully reviewed the applications and have selected the 10 most deserving applicants from across the country.

This year's judging panel included Scott Dowsett, President of MPA Victoria, Scott Robinson, plumber and former TAFE teacher of the year, Kevin Price, National Service Training and Systems Manager at Rheem Australia and Aimee Stanton, plumber turned DIY and Tiny House creator.

"Since launching the Rheem Apprentice Plumber Grants in 2012, we have discovered just how many remarkable apprentices there are around Australia," concludes Taylor.

Each Rheem Apprentice Plumber Grant recipient will receive \$2,000 to assist with their TAFE/RTO fees and textbooks, \$1,000 to help them build their all-important trade toolbox, and a tool tote bag for transport and storage of their tools on the jobsite.

Since the Rheem Apprentice Plumber Grants program was launched in 2012, over \$300,000 in Grants have been awarded to apprentice plumbers.
